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Chapter 1: SND Convention Mission

The Annual Snowmobile North Dakota Convention is to be scheduled during a Friday, Saturday, and Sunday during the month of October or November. The convention is booked two years in advance and all hosting nominations must be submitted to the SND office a week prior to the upcoming convention. The SND Convention Committee will assist the club/association hosting the event.

1.1 Mission Statement

Snowmobile North Dakota's organizational mission is "to generate excitement for the sport of snowmobiling". This goal must be carried through in the development of all Snowmobile North Dakota tasks and events. This initial mission will direct the club/association in the development of the Snowmobile North Dakota Annual Convention.

Mission: "Generate Excitement for the sport of snowmobiling."

1.2 Vision Statement

The Snowmobile North Dakota Convention Vision is "to provide a reasonable, fun, and family orientated event for all members and snowmobilers to enjoy."

Convention Goals:

A. Reasonable Registration Costs:

As the cost of living rises and it gets more expensive to enjoy snowmobiling each year, please keep in mind the organization does not want to compromise a snowmobiling trip for the convention. Both of these are very important objectives, so the SND Convention Committee asks the costs be reasonable. This should also be kept in mind for large snowmobiling families who would like to participate in the event.

B. Activities for All Ages:

The general membership of Snowmobile North Dakota ranges in the 40-65 age group. However, there are still a lot of young families joining the organization. These young families are the livelihood of the organization so let's do our best to provide activities for all ages. Remember, the more the kids enjoy the convention, the more hope there is of the family attending the next years convention.

C. Promoting snowmobile safety and establishing members input in a fun environment:

The SND Convention is meant to discuss the latest snowmobile issues facing the recreation on a local, state, national, and international level. While this business is necessary, it is also necessary to incorporate fun to keep the interest and passion for the sport of snowmobiling alive throughout the event and upcoming season.

D. Focusing on the heart of the organization by promoting its mission:

Snowmobile North Dakota was established because snowmobilers over several generations focused on the above mission. This mission must be carried through

in all events to continue the success of what the first Snowmobile North Dakota generation started!

1.3 Convention Funds

In 2004, the Snowmobile North Dakota annual meeting representatives voted to pay an additional \$1 for each membership. This \$1 is placed in a Convention Fund savings account and up to 80% of the funds collected the previous year before the convention can be provided to the hosting club/association to offset convention costs. The \$1 shall offset the costs of a convention registration fee providing free attendance to the meetings and classes required by Snowmobile North Dakota. The funds will be dispersed after April 1st but no later than June 30th of each year.

Chapter 2: SND Convention Requirements

The Snowmobile North Dakota Board of Directors uses the convention to meet certain business requirements outlined in the organizations bylaws. After several attempts in changing the convention schedule, the Board has selected a schedule which fulfills the needs of the organization and its members. Please review the following information and provide it to the convention center during the preliminary set-up of the event. During the finalization of the convention schedule, please review the times and dates for meetings and classes with the SND Convention Committee before publication.

2.1 Schedule Requirements

The Trail Signing Class can be scheduled during the noon luncheon to provide additional time in the afternoon for alternate activities.

If possible, the instructors for the Groomer Maintenance & Operations Class and the Trail Grubbing Equipment Operations Class like to host the class in doors to avoid harsh weather.

During the banquet please provide approximately 20 minutes for the SND President's award presentation.

 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. Regional Breakout Sessions

Breakfast can be held during the Board of Directors meeting.

The Regional Breakout Sessions can be held in the same room as the Breakfast and Board of Directors meeting if preferred.

2.2 Required Rooms Block

The Snowmobile North Dakota Board of Directors consists of 21 people. Please reserve a block of hotel rooms to occupy the Board of Directors. All rooms not reserved three weeks prior to the event may be opened to the public for reservation. Once the rooms are blocked provide the hotel information, phone number, and block name to the SND Program Manager. The Program Manager will provide the information to the Board of Directors. The following estimates are based on the approximate number of people attending previous conventions.

A. Friday Board of Directors Meeting:	30 People
B. Annual Meeting:	100 People
C. Trail Signing Class:	100 People
D. Groomer & Trail Grubbing Class:	30 People Each

H. Regional Breakout Sessions:	50 People

The Regional Breakout Session room must be big enough to split the four regions into separate areas of the room. If placing each region in a different room estimate approximately 15 people for each region.

Chapter 3: SND Training Classes

Snowmobile North Dakota hosts three training classes each year. Please provide time and spacing for these classes. If there is an alternate class which is being offered, the Convention Committee will contact the hosting club/association with the required information.

3.2 Classroom Requirements

- A. Trail Signing Class

1. If Free, LCD Projector
2. LCD Screen
3. Classroom Style Set-Up
4. Interactive Video Network (IVN) Conferencing

B. Groomer Maintenance & Operations Class

1. Room large enough to fit a groomer
2. IVN Conferencing

C. Trail Grubbing Equipment Maintenance & Operations Class

1. Room large enough to fit a utility vehicle and a pull behind mower
2. Easy access to outdoors for hands-on-training

IVN is not a strict requirement, but if it is available please contact the SND Program Manager for possible set-up for the classes.

Chapter 4: Convention Entertainment

All Convention Entertainment is up to the discretion of the hosting club/association. The following sections list optional items to help in convention planning.

4.2 Optional Entertainment

The following items are not required and are simply optional entertainment suggestions:

- A. Video Game Racing
- B. Hospitality Rooms
- C. Dance
- D. Clown

4.3 Insurance

Snowmobile North Dakota secures the insurance policies under the trail association name. Due to this, all advertising must be placed under the trail association name in order to qualify for insurance coverage explained in detail in the SND's Trail Guidelines handbook in Chapter 8. Please review section 8.2 in SND's Trail Guidelines manual to determine if additional insurance

is needed for particular events during the convention. All costs incurred for the additional insurance are to be covered by the trail association hosting the event.

Chapter 5: Convention Advertisement

5.1 Sno-Dak News

The hosting club/association shall receive a full page ad on the last page of the Sno-Dak News for free in the September issue. In order to receive two months of free advertising, Snowmobile North Dakota shall receive a free booth located in the display area or by the registration booth pending there is not a display area. The minimum size requirements needed for the SND Booth is 15'x15'.

5.2 SND Website

Convention information can be placed on the SND website on the homepage and in the website's calendar.

- A. Homepage Information: can include links to registration forms, websites, and flyers.
- B. Calendar: all convention information not in the formats mentioned above.

Additional information can be provided to the Program Manager after posting the initial convention information in the calendar. The Program Manager has editing capabilities after items are posted.

5.3 Free Public Access Information

This is a great way to receive advertising for the upcoming events for free. Most of the television stations in the state have a community public access channel which provides free advertising for an upcoming event. Contact the local television stations for more information.

There are also free websites such as www.bismanonline.com and www.farmooronline.com which allow free announcements for upcoming events. Please visit these websites and search for local websites to gain more attention for the upcoming convention.

5.4 Press Releases

Press releases regarding the upcoming event can be provided to Snowmobile North Dakota. Snowmobile North Dakota will mail the press release to the media contacts in the state. To ensure the press release is placed in the local papers and announced on local radio stations contact the businesses directly. This should ensure the press releases being utilized to promote the convention.

5.5 Fleecing Current Convention Attendees

Start generating excitement for the following years convention during the current convention. Here are several examples on how to do this:

- A. Hang up/pass around flyers
- B. Place information in the convention registration packets
- C. Provide samples of local products with the convention date and location on them

Chapter 6: Sponsorships / Prizes

6.1 Acquiring Sponsorships

The convention expenses start to grow quite costly as things are added up overtime. Provide free advertising and/or recognition to businesses that are willing to support the event through monetary means.

6.2 Acquiring Prizes

Prize Suggestions:

- C. Contact large snowmobile resorts wanting to gain additional tourism
- D. Local businesses supporting the trail system

Beverage distributing companies usually have the capabilities to print banners. Contact them to print the free banners recognizing those businesses providing sponsorship of the event.

6.3 Chamber of Commerce

Contact the local Chamber of Commerce for assistance in hosting the event. The Chamber of Commerce shall usually provide assistance with the following:

- A. Registration Personnel
- B. Registration Packets
- C. Name Badges
- D. Welcome Banner
